

## THE CALL FOR NUCLEAR DISARMAMENT

The continued possession, further development, and manufacture of nuclear weapons by the United States undermines the ethical basis of our society, breaks treaties our nation has signed, wastes our nation's wealth, and permanently contaminates our environment, while providing no real contribution to U.S. national security.

In fact, implicit and explicit nuclear threats by the U.S. undermine global efforts to halt proliferation of not just nuclear weapons, but all weapons of mass destruction. Meanwhile our own nuclear facilities can never be made fully secure from accident, sabotage, theft, or attack.

New Mexico's two nuclear weapons labs lead the world in spending for weapons of mass destruction. But as the labs have grown, New Mexico's relative economic standing has declined and now trails almost all other states.

### We therefore call upon our elected leaders to:

- Stop the design and manufacture of all nuclear weapons, including plutonium bomb cores ("pits") at Los Alamos and elsewhere.
- Dismantle our nuclear arsenal in concert with other nuclear powers, pursuant to Article VI of the Nuclear Nonproliferation Treaty. As the most powerful nation on earth, the U.S. must take the first steps in this process.
- Halt disposal of nuclear waste at Los Alamos, as thousands of citizens and dozens of environmental organizations have already requested.

### We demand quite different priorities:

- affordable health care for everyone
- better education
- renewable energy
- economic opportunity for those who have none.

We call for investment in our people and families, in our economy and environment, instead of in preparation for nuclear war.

## WHY LOS ALAMOS?

Los Alamos laboratory designed and assembled the bombs that destroyed Hiroshima and Nagasaki. Today, Los Alamos National Laboratory (LANL) is the largest facility for weapons of mass destruction in the world in dollar terms.

Almost half (49%) of all U.S. nuclear warhead spending occurs within just 60 miles of Los Alamos, and more nuclear weapons are kept in nearby Albuquerque than any other single place in the world.

For the next 15 years if not for longer, LANL will be the only place in the U.S. where plutonium bomb cores ("pits") are manufactured, a mission we hope to make impossible. LANL also has the largest active nuclear disposal site in the Southwest, where millions of drums and boxes of nuclear waste are planned to be disposed over the coming decades.

## DAY OF REMEMBRANCE AND ACTION

On Saturday, August 6, 2005, the Los Alamos Study Group and endorsing organizations will commemorate the 60th anniversary of the Hiroshima and Nagasaki bombings with an all-day conference and teach-in at Ashley Pond Park in Los Alamos.

We will be firm on the basic questions of nuclear weapons and disarmament, which are moral and legal in nature and not just matters of policy. We will develop and present positive alternatives to current (in)security policies and positive alternatives for economic and social development in New Mexico. We will not be personally confrontational and we will be nonviolent in both word and deed. We ask that all participating organizations agree to this core principle of nonviolence and more generally to the broad purposes of the event as stated in this brochure.

## AUGUST 6TH SCHEDULE

The day's events will begin at 10:00 am and continue all day at Ashley Pond Park and in adjacent public buildings.

In the morning we will have our keynote speaker, other talks, and music. At noon we will stage a symbolic pageant with thousands of sunflowers, the international emblem of nuclear disarmament. (Sunflowers became the symbol of disarmament after they were ritually sown into the earth at a Russian missile silo destroyed after the Cold War.) Lunch will be available at the park and local restaurants. After lunch there will be more music and workshops led by participating groups. We'll break for dinner then return to the park to set hundreds of candle lanterns afloat on the pond.

## THE PURPOSE OF THIS EVENT

In addition to commemorating the Hiroshima and Nagasaki bombings we will also make visible the strong support that polls show is now present in the U.S. for nuclear disarmament—84% in one large recent poll ([www.pipa.org](http://www.pipa.org); see April 15, 2004).

We want to bridge issues and we aim to build bridges between organizations as well. We want to assist in the emergence of a political culture based on the dignity of the human person, as opposed to an ever more pervasive politics of fear, hatred, greed, and war. Any such political movement and platform must include from the outset the vigorous rejection of weapons of mass destruction as instruments of state power.

This event as well as the organizing involved in it are intimately tied to the *Call for Nuclear Disarmament* (see reverse). We are just beginning the “Call” campaign but it has already been endorsed by some 200 regional businesses, organizations, and political leaders. We will publicly link this growing groundswell with related international efforts.

We are concerned with more than just nuclear weapons. In Iraq, the U.S. is engaged in a bloody war of occupation responsible for the deaths of more than 100,000 people so far. And now, U.S. military units are operating in Iran in preparation for a possible attack on that country. The primary justification offered for these adventures is “counterproliferation”—yet right here in New Mexico, designing and building nuclear weapons is considered “normal.” We are at risk of becoming, in E. L. Doctorow’s phrase, “the people of the bomb.”

New Mexico’s nuclear labs, and especially Los Alamos, provide a uniquely symbolic and persuasive context from which to effectively condemn the hypocritical folly of recent U.S. “security” policy. Join us here on August 6 and help strengthen the community of active resistance in New Mexico.

Humanity now faces an unprecedented combination of challenges involving climate, security, poverty, environment, energy, and health. We understand that we need a breakthrough—that we need new thinking, inspired career choices, and a deeper personal commitment to be part of the solution rather than the problem. If our social and political commitment to nuclear weapons and all they imply remains intact, no breakthrough will be possible, and the torch of humanity may dim or even fall. Especially in New Mexico, we will regress unless we free ourselves from the stranglehold of militarization and embrace policies which are just, humane, secure, and sustainable.
